Lent refers to the lengthening of days during spring when each day is lighter for a longer period of time. Trees and flowers are in bud as we anticipate the renewal of life and change of seasons. Lent is a period of preparation before Easter. Lenten practices bring us back to basics and help us to prune away the distractions and excesses of daily life. In parish life, popular devotions include prayer services, Stations of the Cross, *Bible* study and other actions that bring us more in touch with the source of our faith. Lent is a season for repentance and forgiveness. Each year, during lent, we are called to turn our lives around through a conversion of heart, and to move forward on a path towards new life in God.

Play Jacob's Ladder Select a Knowledge Category – *Prophets & Kings or Psalms & Proverbs* – and review the challenges of the prophets for justice and mercy. Make the heartfelt prayers and psalms of the Hebrew people your own, asking for God's help and forgiveness.

Review Open your *Bible* to the Book of Psalms and work together as a family or in small groups to identify a favorite Psalm that relates to current experiences in your family life (i.e., *Hymn of Thanksgiving... Hymn of a Grateful Heart... The Need of God's Blessing... The Lord, Shepherd and Host). Ask everyone to read aloud from the psalm(s) chosen.*

Discuss How did you choose your Psalm? How does it give meaning to what you are doing right now in your life?
